OUR HOME

THE ANCIENT SOILS AND COLD CLIMATE OF TASMANIA

For more than a decade, the House of Arras team has identified and developed the ideal vineyard sites for world-class sparkling wine. This journey has led the House of Arras to call the ancient soils and cold climate of Tasmania home. Its climate is significantly cooler than the mainland, with long summer daylight and maritime influences, which are ideal conditions for long, slow and consistent fruit development.



ARRAS Brut Elite

The elegant style of Brut Elite is driven by the high portion of red fruits, Pinot Noir 57% and Pinot Meunier 8%, creating the velvety texture and rich flavours. A seamless palate of sophistication and poise displaying secondary flavours of field mushroom and brioche that overlay the lychee fruit, that further builds complexity and persistence. The Pinot Meunier also adds the delicate, soft and luscious characters, with firm natural acidity providing a backbone for the longevity and vibrancy of this wine.

Appearance

Light to medium straw colour, retains a brilliant clarity and an ultra-fine and persistent bead.

Aroma

Exotic characters are drawn together in this captivating wine including lychee, white stone fruit, lanolin and oyster shell.

Palate

A seamless palate of sophistication and poise, red fruit driven with generous flavours and texture. Secondary flavours of field mushroom and brioche build on the complexity and persistence.



Our Philosophy

At JUSTIN, we combine traditional Old World methods—like hand-harvesting and small-barrel aging in French oak—with New World technology. For example, the “Air Knife”, an ingenious New World process invented by our winemakers, boosts grape quality and efficiency.

Once the grapes are harvested, our winemakers—some of the best in the business—gather to sort, select, age, taste, blend, and decide what goes into every bottle.

We planted our first vineyard back in 1981 with a mission to make world-class Bordeaux-style blends. Since then, we’ve expanded both our knowledge of viticulture in this unique region as well as our acreage.

Meet Our Winemaker

After creating award-winning wine in Napa Valley for 13 vintages, JUSTIN Winemaker Scott Shirley took on the challenge of an entirely new appellation: Paso Robles. He combines a scientific background with an artistic approach, and greets each harvest like a painter facing a blank canvas with endless possibilities.

Sauvignon Blanc**

Our Sauvignon Blanc reflects the diversity of the climates and soils in the Central Coast that range from the cool, limestone-laden Templeton Gap area to the warmer, sandy, river-influenced eastern regions. We’ve combined sauvignon blanc grown in vineyards with diverse climates and soils to give our JUSTIN Sauvignon Blanc a clean, textured palate with bright citrus and tropical fruit with a hint of fresh herbs balanced with a crisp, refreshing mineral structure. The result is a wine that is both a refreshing summer aperitif and a perfect food pairing wine for an amazing range of cheeses, seafood, or light dining options, such as appetizers or tapas.

Cabernet Sauvignon**

With attractive aromas of black fruit and spice, this smooth, ready-to-drink Cabernet Sauvignon is made in Paso Robles with the same care as the highest quality, traditionally crafted Bordeaux-style wines. Our grapes are hand-picked and sorted by-the-berry for consistent quality and flavor. JUSTIN Cabernet Sauvignon then spends fourteen months in traditional small oak barrels to impart depth and complexity, highlighting the exceptional balance of flavors and textures that the unique climate and soils of Paso Robles add to the classic Cabernet character in this exceptional wine.



The Best of California Vineyards

Landmark Vineyards sources grapes from the finest vineyards in California, including Sonoma, Monterey and Santa Barbara Counties, to produce wines that capture the uniqueness of the region, appellation, and at the pinnacle, a single vineyard.

We source from vineyards that each claim a unique microclimate and soil composition. Through careful blending, our winemaker creates wines that balance and enhance those characteristics. The resulting blend is greater than the sum of its parts.



Greg Stach, Winemaker

Greg Stach is renowned for crafting elegant, world-class vintages. Stach's winemaking approach combines traditional techniques with a "less is more" philosophy. Believing that great wine begins in the vineyard, he intervenes only to ensure consistency and quality, relying more on the fruit's intense flavors and distinct vineyard characteristics.

Overlook Chardonnay

Tasting Note

Golden highlights shine through the yellow core. The nose is powerful, and initially the wine shows the trademark tree fruits of apples and pears with lemon curd, but the time in bottle has revealed the savory notes of chamomile tea, almond, and bread. The palette is brighter than the nose would lead you to believe with moderately high acidity offering a refreshing freshness that pierces through the flavors of lemon curd, baked apple, dried pears. Mineral notes and toasted oak are evident on the lengthy finish.

Overlook Pinot Noir

Tasting Note

Medium purple/ruby color with attractive aromas of strawberry compote, red cherry and plum with toasted oak, vanilla and cinnamon spice, leather, red licorice, a little camphor with subtle purple floral notes. On the palate the wine is moderate to not quite full-bodied with ripe fruit of red berry, cherry and plum with vanilla, cinnamon and toasted oak leading into a mid-palate that features leather, a touch of dried herbs, camphor with underlying earthy notes. The finish is moderately long and fresh with lingering fruit, barrel spice and perfectly balanced tannins.

An intriguing spicy and savoury pinot with a come hither personality and a rewarding finish. Supple and elegant, offering fresh strawberry and cranberry flavors that mingle well with mineral and fresh herb accents. A note of matcha lingers on the finish, with powdery tannins.

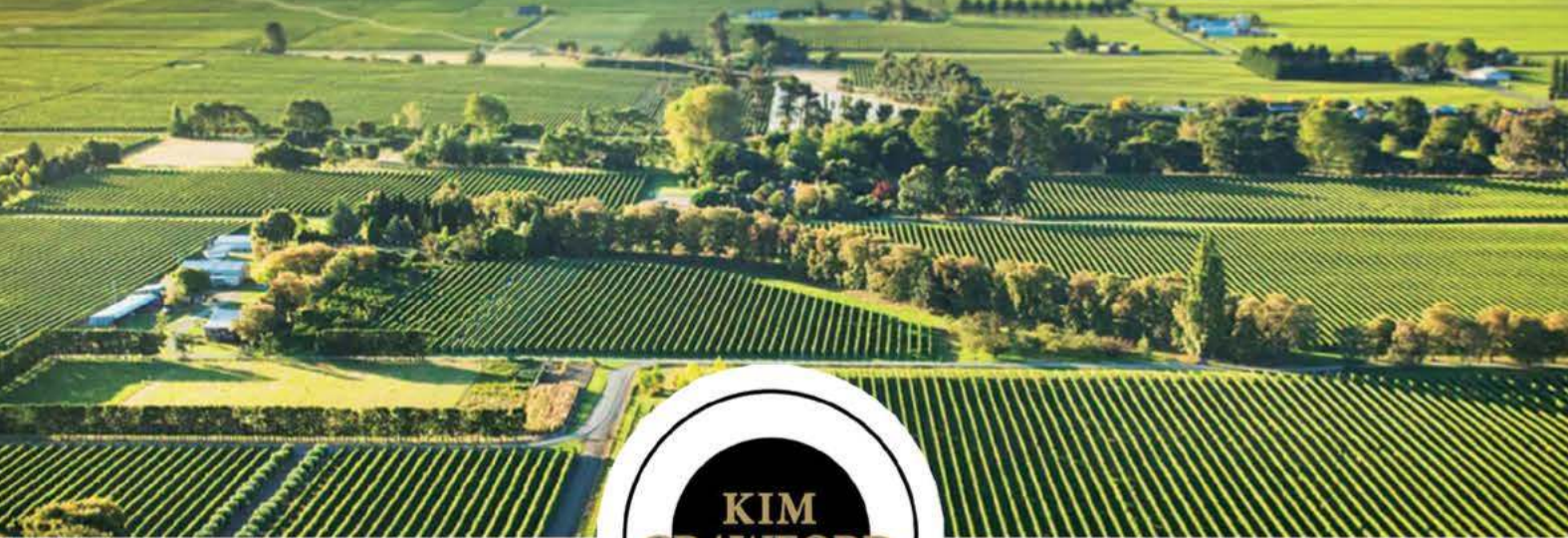
The typical pinot gris is full-bodied with a fresh, spicy flavor and notes of tropical fruit, stone fruit, or citrus. (The riper the grapes, the less acidic the wine tends to be.) Although most pinot gris is dry, a small amount of prized Alsace pinot gris is sweet.

Tasting Note

Pungent, vibrant, fresh, youthful and very fruity bouquet. Classic too, with aromas of fresh green herbs of basil and sage then red apple, pineapple, green mango and white peach. On the palate - equally vibrant with flavours that mirror the nose plus jelapeno. High acidity adds spice and lift, freshness and length.



Kim Crawford is one of New Zealand's most exciting and innovative wine producers. The winery started out in a small cottage in Auckland, New Zealand and since its launch in 1996, the label has gained critical acclaim around the globe. We do things unconventionally, take risks, start things, and welcome different

The unique and varied geography of New Zealand helps to insulate our vineyards and protect the grapes from the elements. With grapes grown between the latitudes of 34° and 47°, our growing regions cover a distance of 1,000 miles from the northern tip of the country to the southern coast. Such a large growing area gives Kim Crawford the distinct advantage of a wide range of local climates and soil types to promote distinctive regional flavors and characteristics.

The vineyards of Kim Crawford are located in outstanding, predominantly coastal sites. The grapes benefit from long days, clean sea breezes and crisp nights. In combination with New Zealand's long and dry autumn season, our grapes ripen slowly, which allows them to build flavor intensity as well as develop a sophisticated acidity. In the end, it is this unique combination of factors—from regions and soils, to temperatures and growth rates—that give Kim Crawford a perfect balance of fruit and acidity. This ideal pairing of elements makes Kim Crawford more than just the perfect wine to compliment foods and occasions—it makes it the perfect wine to compliment one of the most stunning regions the world has ever known.

Apple, pear, lemon, apricot, ginger, melon, papaya, and white floral notes. When it's aged in oak or undergoes malolactic fermentation, there can also be buttery-toasty notes, which can sometimes be confused with flavors inherently found in the grape.

Dusky Sounds epitomises New Zealand's unique personality. Strong varietal characters and lifted, pungent aromatics along with clean and inviting flavours result in a range of great value wines.

Pale straw. Lifted notes of fresh grapefruit, kiwi fruit and nettles. The fresh and concentrated fruit flavours continue on the palate while the lively acidity gives the wine its crisp, mouth watering finish.

Straw colour. Ripe aromas of stone fruit and melons with a hint of honeysuckle and spice. The palate is lovely and juicy with ripe round flavours and a refreshing finish.



PETALUMA

Petaluma was founded in 1976 on the simple belief that to make the best wine, you must plant the right grape varieties in the right regions. This is our ‘distinguished vineyards’ philosophy. Cabernet from Coonawarra, Chardonnay from the Adelaide Hills and Riesling from the Clare Valley remain the basis of the Petaluma range to this day.

We go beyond simply choosing the right region for the right grape variety; we select the individual site that will deliver the best possible outcome. All Petaluma sites have been meticulously chosen based on their aspect, soil, drainage and rainfall to ensure ultimate site expression with minimal inputs.

We tend our vineyards by hand, which is the only way to ensure optimum quality in varied terrain. This approach to picking and pruning is evident in all Petaluma’s finished wines.

Control of yield is also integral to our approach. Few farmers will willingly dispose of their crop, but regular crop thinning ensures consistent quality and intensity in Petaluma wines.

Our top tier Yellow Label wines are made exclusively from grapes grown on vineyards directly controlled by us. The Petaluma team takes the ultimate attention to every detail to ensure only the finest fruit makes its way to the weigh bridge.

The resulting Yellow Label wines are true classics in both style and regionality, offering serious longevity in the cellar. Our White Label wines offer an introduction to Petaluma, expressing the same regions in wines that are more approachable in their youth.

The Petaluma Project Co range is their avenue to express this innovation in limited release wines showcasing alternative varieties and different production techniques.

Fruit from all three regions is crushed, vinified, matured and bottled in our state-of-the-art winery in the Adelaide Hills, which is the beating heart of Petaluma.



Petaluma Adelaide Hills Shiraz

A medium-bodied and complex wine with luscious raspberry and dark berry fruits, alongside liquorice, white pepper and spicy cedar notes. The palate continues with a generous, sweet-fruit mid palate with mocha oak notes and talc-like tannins providing excellent structure with a lingering persistence of raspberry fruits.

Tasting Note

A spicy, brooding aromatic dry red. The bouquet is fragrant with black fruits and loaded with spice and pepper. The palate has dark chocolate and delicate cinnamon oak and finishes with lovely black cherry and plum.



Petaluma Adelaide Hills Cabernet Sauvignon

This Coonawarra Cabernet Sauvignon is an elegant and full flavoured, rich dry red that shows the spicy, juicy bright fruits for which the region is renowned. Aromas of liquorice cassis and cedar are complemented by black fruits and a lovely hint of mint and Cabernet leaf. The palate is bright and juicy, with lovely supple tannins.

Tasting Note

Aromas of liquorice cassis and cedar are complemented by black fruits and a lovely hint of mint and Cabernet leaf. The palate is bright and juicy, is elegant and has lovely soft sandy abundant tannin



Petaluma Adelaide Hills Pinot Gris

Flavours of Nashi pear & orange blossom are present on the nose with crunchy pear and lemon pith on the palate. This Pinot Gris is high in natural acidity and minerality with white florals and a crisp finish.

Tasting Note

A classic high country, cool climate racy acidity with crunchy pears and apples. Complex nuances of oak and ginger, hints of stone fruits and lemon and lime herald slurpable, full flavoured Pinot Gris.



Petaluma Adelaide Hills Sauvignon Blanc

Pale straw in colour the wine displays tropical notes combined with herbaceous undertones. The palate is dry with hints of passionfruit, citrus and freshly cut grass with lingering crisp acidity. Enjoy this wine in its youth with lightly crumbed King George whiting or garfish.

Tasting Note

A faint herbal note combines with warm hay and cut grass, the palate is rich and full with lovely texture and tropical fruit, and finishes with crisp vibrant acidity.



Petaluma Adelaide Hills Chardonnay

A full flavoured, rich textured wine. Lemon and lime complement white peach and ripe nectarine with a lovely hint of gun flint and smoky oak. The palate is long and has a wonderful acid line, with lemon meringue and citrus zest on the finish.

Tasting Note

Is a is a bright, fruit forward wine, and has lovely citrus and stone fruits. The palate is dominated by grapefruit and melon, hints of white peach and is framed by crisp acidity and lovely subtle oak.



Petaluma Hanlin Hill Clare Valley Riesling

The slate geology and climate of the site are perfect for production of the highest quality Riesling with a backbone of high natural acidity and the intense lime flavours characteristic of Petaluma Riesling.

Tasting Note

This is a concentrated wine with intense lime, hints of chalkiness accompanied with beautifully balanced acidity and the slight presence of viscosity.



Petaluma Coonawarra White Label Dry Rose

The grapes are grown in the distinguished sites reflective of the optimum variety and regional combination. These wines are perfect to enjoy upon their release and compliment occasions with friends, family and food.

Tasting Note

Salmon in colour with a blush of violet hue, the wine has strawberry, cranberry fruit with hints of vesty grapefruit. The palate is fresh with juicy raspberry and blueberry and great natural acid.



Katnook's rich history stretches back to 1896, when Coonawarra's first vintage was crafted in our Woolshed by entrepreneurial wine pioneer, John Riddoch - who immigrated from Scotland. He recognised the enormous potential of the maritime climate and unique terra rossa soils which now define Coonawarra wine styles.

But it all began even earlier. In 1861, Riddoch arrived in Coonawarra, after successfully operating a trading post in the goldfields. He purchased vast parcels of land over the years and was impressed with the remarkable rate of growth of fruit trees and vines. In 1867 John commissioned the building of his 'Woolshed' which still operates as Katnook's barrel room today. Determined to encourage closer settlement in the southeast, in 1890 Riddoch formed the Coonawarra Fruit Colony, established its administration headquarters at 'Katnook' and sold off his land in 10 acre blocks. It was here at 'Katnook' that the Coonawarra wine region was born.

Riddoch planted 140 acres of vines and his first vintage in 1895 was a modest event in a neighbouring nursery shed. However, his second, with a much greater volume of fruit and attended to by qualified winemaker William Salter was made in the woolshed at 'Katnook' in 1896. By all accounts this second vintage gave an indication of the outstanding quality that was to come.

TASTING NOTES

A well structured, medium bodied wine, expressing rich dark berry fruits, sweet spice and subtle oak maturation characters.

VINEYARD NOTES

Coonawarra received good winter rains, which set up the vines well for the growing season. Temperatures during the growing season were warm with minimal heat spikes, the steady temperatures continued through vintage. There was minimal vintage rains, which reduced any pressure of disease.

PRODUCTION NOTES

Select parcels of this wine were matured for an average of 15 month in a combination of older French and American oak barrique and hogshead barrels.

FOOD PAIRING NOTES

Roast rack of lamb with herb crust, shepherd's pie or gnocchi with blue cheese sauce.



Katnook 10 Acres Shiraz

This Shiraz expresses the cool Coonawarra climate with lifted aromas and flavours of mulberries, blackberries and spice with finely polished tannins.

Tasting Note

Leather and oaky notes on the nose with undertones of dark forest fruits. Soft tannins, blackberry and earthy notes on the palate.



Katnook 10 Acres Merlot

Steeped in heritage and tradition, the Katnook Estate range of premium quality, single varietal wines are crafted from selected distinguished vineyards and are an expression of the classic and unique characteristics of the Coonawarra wine region.

Tasting Note

This Merlot displays excellent varietal characteristics of rich plum, cherry and sweet spice layered with elegant notes and smooth fine tannins.



Katnook 10 Acres Cabernet Sauvignon

Katnook Estate Cabernet Sauvignon is one of 65 wines listed in the 'Excellent' category of the Langton's VI, Classification of Australian Wine.

Tasting Note

This Cabernet expresses the Katnook Terroir with classic notes of rich dark berries and hints of mint and spicy cedar oak.



OUR STORY

The Nobilo story began in 1943, when our namesake, Nikola Nobilo moved from his native Croatia to New Zealand. Combining over 300 years of his families' winemaking tradition, Nikola was an early champion for New Zealand wine. He recognized the pristine landscape was ideal for Sauvignon Blanc with expansive sunlight valleys, rolling hills and mineral rich soils creating a unique fresh and crisp flavor profile. His focus on quality and a move toward varietal wines helped guide the industry to its success today.



Nobilo Sauvignon Blanc

Nobilo Icon Sauvignon Blanc represents the pinnacle of our winemaking sourcing from our "Favourite" vineyard in the Awatare valley of Marlborough. The style of wine is focused on bright fruit intensity and balance.

Food Matching

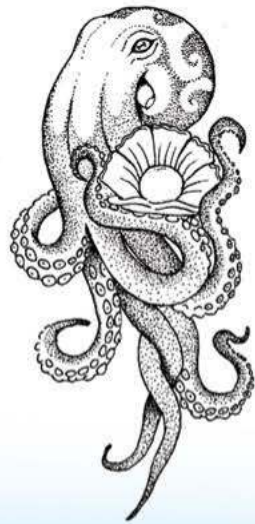

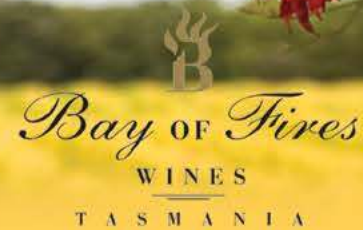

Dalwhinnie

When the water you start with comes from the highest mountain source of any malt, you expect something rather fine. And Dalwhinnie, for whisky writer Roger Voss a “surprisingly soft whisky...from Scotland’s highest, most remote distillery”, does not disappoint. The source, Lochan an Doire-Uaine, (*Gaelic* for “lake in the green grove”), lies at 2,000 feet in the Drumochter Hills. From it, all the pure spring water used in distilling Dalwhinnie flows over rich local peat through Allt an t’Sluic, the distillery burn. No other distillery may use the water from this source – therefore no other distillery is able to yield Dalwhinnie’s uniquely clean, accessible, malty-sweet taste, giving way to a smooth and smoky Highland mouthfeel.

Dalwhinnie distillery is situated between the gentle, grassy style of the Lowlands and the austere, firm body of Speyside, which begins some 25 miles to the north. The style is that of the Highlands; a resilient marriage of gentleness and spirit.

As befits a malt from such a place, Dalwhinnie defies simple description. Too gratifying for an aperitif alone, yet too gentle and delicate to be thought rugged or unapproachable; this combination of delicacy and depth sets it apart.

HISTORY

There have been distilleries at Lagavulin since the 18th century; though it wasn’t until 1816 that farmer John Johnston founded the first legal operation. A year later a second distillery appeared, this one run by Archibald Campbell. The two were united under a Glasgow trader, and in 1887, Peter Mackie arrived at the distillery, under whose guiding hand the distillery, and the name Lagavulin, was to become the last word in Islay malt.

THE DISTILLERY

Miles and miles of peat bog in the west of the island provide the raw material which imbues the barley with that distinct smoky flavour. Not to mention the rich peaty water that runs down the brown burn from the Solan Lochs and into the distillery. In case you haven’t figured it out, the smoky, peated Lagavulin is seen as the ultimate expression of this region.

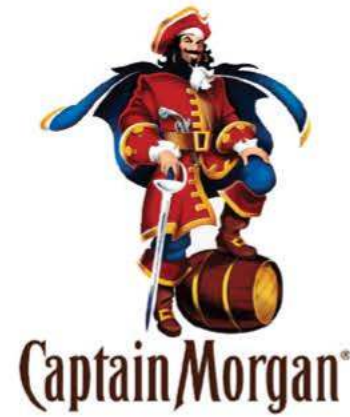

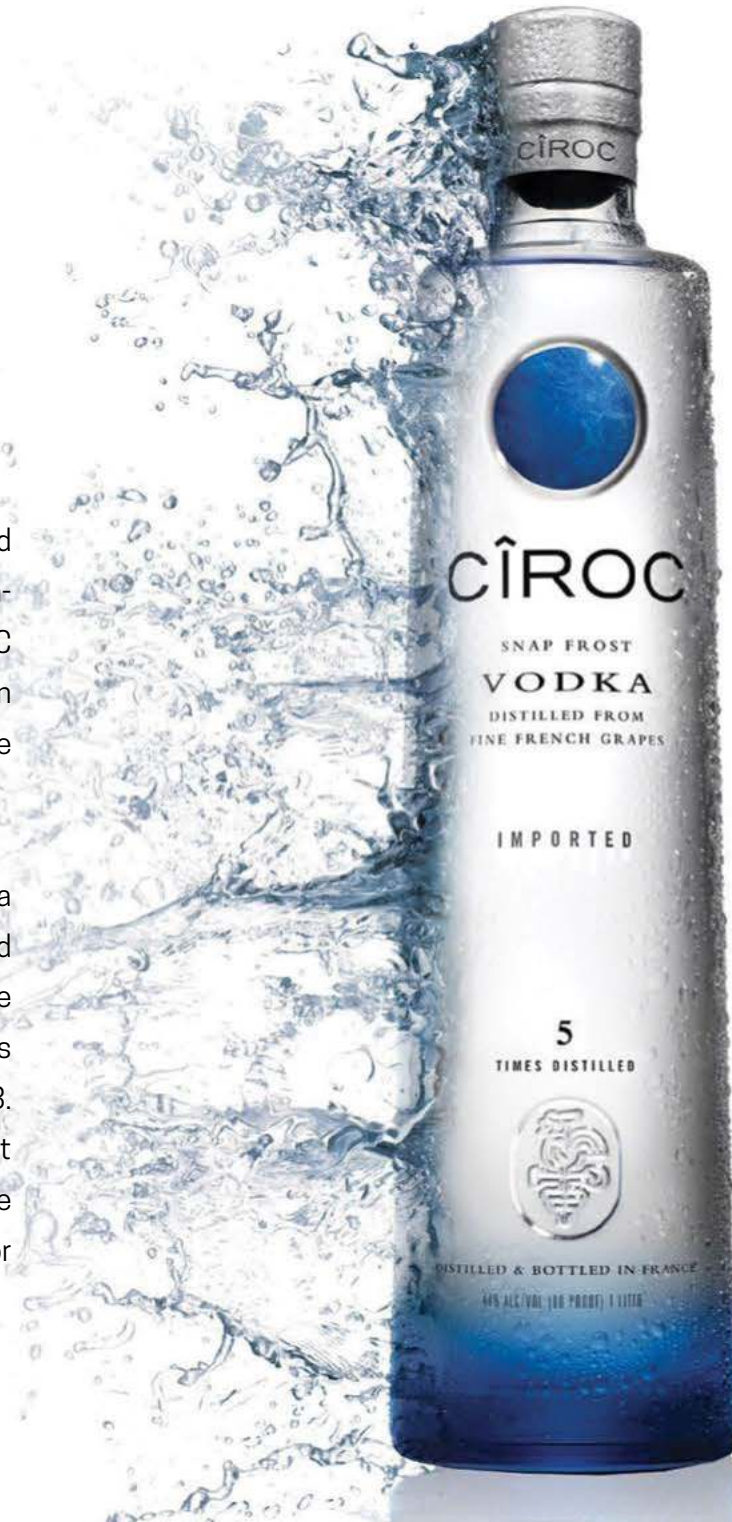
